



Joint Parish Planning "Creating One New Parish for All"

Spotlight On: The Facilities and Cemetery Subcommittee

As the planning progresses toward forming our new Parish, developing a strategy for utilizing, managing, and maintaining all our properties and facilities to include our cemeteries is a critical component of the transition. Our focus in this column is the Facilities and Cemetery Subcommittee that has been assigned this important task.

What is the mission of your Subcommittee?

The mission of this subcommittee is multifaceted. First, to develop an inventory of all the properties, facilities, and equipment that make up each of the existing Parishes and cemeteries in Rome, Lee Center, and Holland Patent. Second, to assess their overall condition, utilization, maintenance, and management requirements. Third, to identify the current staff positions and job responsibilities in each facility to determine any similar and unique capabilities. Finally, develop a recommendation for the most cost effective and efficient use, management, maintenance, and staffing necessary for the smooth operation of all aspects our new Parish and its cemeteries.

What are the tasks, actions, or goals of the Subcommittee?

To accomplish our mission a thorough survey of all properties and facilities at every location to include the cemeteries was conducted to develop a compete inventory of the equipment, condition, utilization, and maintenance needs, as well as the current staffing and an understanding of their job responsibilities. Our goal was to develop a recommended strategy and staffing plan to optimize the utilization of our existing facilities, provide an appropriate level of management and adequate maintenance and repair.

What is your strategy for achieving your goals?

Members of the subcommittee conducted walkthroughs of all the facilities with the individuals currently responsible for maintaining them. The results of these walkthroughs were discussed at subcommittee meetings where strategies for blending and sharing staff, providing routine maintenance, and performing all the tasking needed to keep each facility and cemetery operating cost effectively and efficiently. Staffing information was provided to the Finance Subcommittee to assist in their mission.

What challenges are you facing and how are you addressing them?

To keep the four (4) cemeteries operating cost effectively and efficiently, common hours of operation, and opening and closing dates need to be established. Currently, only one individual, employed at St. John's cemetery, has been handling all cemetery responsibilities. Additional staffing needs to be recruited and hired prior to the opening of the cemeteries on April 1, 2025, along with an overall manager to oversee operations and schedule staffing. This presents a challenge since our new Parish will not be incorporated until July 2025.

What is the status of achieving your goals and providing your recommendations to the Joint Parish Councils?

Our walkthroughs have been completed, and the subcommittee has had several meetings to discuss results and possible strategies. A facilities manager is needed to oversee all facilities at all locations. One option is instituting a floating crew of 2 people to be assigned by the facilities manager wherever needed. Appointing a separate manager for the operation of the cemeteries is also an option. Proposals are still being discussed, and decisions are pending.

Joint Parish Planning "Creating One New Parish for All"

Spotlight On: The Finance Subcommittee

In our ongoing series introducing each of the subcommittees of the Joint Parish Councils who are working to create a successful transition to our new joint Parish, our focus in this column is the Finance Subcommittee.

What is the mission of your Subcommittee?

The mission of this subcommittee is to look at ways to save money by reducing expenses and how to make money by hosting a variety of fundraisers as we merge into our new Parish effective July 1st. Our combined Parish Trustees will take care of delicate matters that require discretion and review parish bank accounts and financial investment opportunities.

What are the tasks, actions, or goals of the Subcommittee?

Our major goals are determining the number of employees that work for each parish and their job responsibilities. The goal is to merge staff where applicable and ensure that the appropriate level of staff is available to perform all the required duties and tasks. Secondly, the subcommittee will review all the various operational purchases and contracts associated with each parish to save expenses where applicable.

What is your strategy for achieving your goals?

We have asked and received from the Diocese, parish financial statements for the fiscal year July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024. We are comparing them to the individual parish budgets for the same period. The result will be to get a better understanding of total revenues and expenses from all five churches. This information will prove valuable for developing a new, realistic budget for the newly merged parish. Currently, the target date for completion of the merger is July 1, 2025. Under New York State law, the combined churches and the cemeteries must have separate budgets. All church collections will be deposited into one church savings account. All church expenses will be paid from one church checking account.

What challenges are you facing and how are you addressing them?

The amount of information that the subcommittee needs to collect and analyze is tremendous. Each member of our subcommittee has shared ideas on saving money as well as raising money. The subcommittee has provided Father O'Brien with a list of employees from each parish with their job duties. Father O'Brien will review this information with Father Paul Angelicchio and Father Bob Kelly. We have also developed a list of potential fundraisers and savings ideas for the Church Trustees once Father O'Brien has directed us to do so.

What is the status of achieving your goals and providing your recommendations to the Joint Parish Councils?

Our subcommittee held our last meeting on November 11th and meeting minutes were prepared and disseminated to the Joint Parish Councils membership. Future meetings will be scheduled as required.
